THE LAST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST: *CHRIST THE KING SUNDAY* Sunday, 22 November 2020

During this ongoing COVID-19 national emergency, several restrictions have been instituted following guidelines issued by the CDC, civil authorities, and the Diocese of Pennsylvania. At some points in the service, the Celebrant will explain various procedures now in place; and instructions have been placed throughout this bulletin.

For the safety and health of our worshipping community, we ask for your understanding and cooperation. Thank you!

Masks MUST always be worn; gloves are optional. If you did not bring a cloth mask or gloves from home, disposable masks and gloves are available as you enter the church.

Maintain recommended SOCIAL DISTANCE of at least six feet from all other worshippers at all times.

*To assist in Contact Tracing, should that be required in the future, before taking your seat, please check in at the attendance table located in the Narthex. **If you later test positive for the virus, please notify the church office immediately in order for others to be notified.** Thank you!*

Alternating pews have been roped off to assist with social distance seating. Please sit only where indicated. Household groups may be seated together; all others must be seated individually.

Please place your offering in the Collection Plates located in the main aisle.

Sadly, there will be no congregational singing since it has been shown that this action expels droplets far beyond the social distance boundary of six feet. But music is included in the Sunday services and you may recognize some familiar hymns . . . feel free to hum along.

Celebrant Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. ***Amen.***

THE PEACE

All stand.

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People **And also with you.**

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.

People **We lift them to the Lord.**

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

Celebrant It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth; for you are the source of light and life, you made us in your image, and called us to new life in Jesus Christ our Lord.

Therefore, we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who forever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Celebrant & People **Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.**

Hosanna in the highest.

The people continue to stand, or may kneel at this point.

Celebrant Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Celebrant & People **Christ has died.
Christ is risen.
Christ will come again.**

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. **AMEN.**

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Celebrant And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:

THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD, INVITATION & SHARING OF COMMUNION

The Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread.

A period of silence is kept.

Celebrant Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;
People **Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia!**

Celebrant The Gifts of God for the People of God.
Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you,
and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

Due to health concerns at the present time, only the Celebrant will consume both the bread and the wine; the Congregation will receive the Sacrament in one kind, only the bread.

Before distributing the bread to the Congregation, the Celebrant will use hand sanitizer, then put on gloves, as well as a mask.

Bread will be put into the hands of the Communicants without touching or contact.

If you do not want to receive Communion, but desire a no-touch blessing, please come forward, crossing your arms on your chest, to indicate that you do not wish to receive the bread.

Please remain seated until the Usher invites you to come forward.

Maintain social distance while waiting in line. Note the floor markers in the aisle; these are spaced six feet apart and have been put there to assist you in maintaining the social distance boundary.

Communicants are to approach the Celebrant individually, one at a time, to receive the bread or a blessing.

Please return to your seat by the side aisles.

SPIRITUAL COMMUNION PRAYER OF ST. ALPHONSUS DE LIGUORI (1696-1787)

If you choose not to receive the Sacrament, you are invited to pray this prayer:

My Jesus, I believe that you are truly present in the Blessed Sacrament of the altar. I love you above all things, and long for you in my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. As though you have already come, I embrace you and unite myself entirely to you; never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.

POST-COMMUNION PRAYER

Celebrant Let us pray.

Celebrant & People **Eternal God, heavenly Father, you have graciously accepted us as living members of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ, and you have fed us with spiritual food in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood. Send us now into the world in peace, and grant us strength and courage to love and serve you with gladness and singleness of heart; through Christ our Lord. Amen.**

PRAYER FOR THE THANKSGIVING HOLIDAY

Almighty and gracious Father, we give you thanks for the fruits of the earth in their season and for the labors of those who harvest them. Make us, we pray, faithful stewards of your great bounty, for the provision of our necessities and the relief of all who are in need, to the glory of your Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. *Amen.*

BLESSING OF PRAYER SHAWLS, FINAL BLESSING & DISMISSAL

Maintain social distancing as you exit. To assist with this, the Celebrant will not take a position at the door in order to eliminate a 'receiving line'. The Rector will, however, be available following the service should you need to speak with them.

THIS WEEK'S ASSIGNED LESSONS:

Ezekiel 34:11-16, 20-24

Thus says the Lord GOD: I myself will search for my sheep, and will seek them out. ¹²As shepherds seek out their flocks when they are among their scattered sheep, so I will seek out my sheep. I will rescue them from all the places to which they have been scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. ¹³I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries, and will bring them into their own land; and I will feed them on the mountains of Israel, by the watercourses, and in all the inhabited parts of the land. ¹⁴I will feed them with good pasture, and the mountain heights of Israel shall be their pasture; there they shall lie down in good grazing land, and they shall feed on rich pasture on the mountains of Israel. ¹⁵I myself will be the shepherd of my sheep, and I will make them lie down, says the Lord GOD. ¹⁶I will seek the lost, and I will bring back the strayed, and I will bind up the injured, and I will strengthen the weak, but the fat and the strong I will destroy. I will feed them with justice. ²⁰Therefore, thus says the Lord GOD to them: I myself will judge between the fat sheep and the lean sheep. ²¹Because you pushed with flank and shoulder, and butted at all the weak animals with your horns until you scattered them far and wide, ²²I will save my flock, and they shall no longer be ravaged; and I will judge between sheep and sheep. ²³I will set up over them one shepherd, my servant David, and he shall feed them: he shall feed them and be their shepherd. ²⁴And I, the LORD, will be their God, and my servant David shall be prince among them; I, the LORD, have spoken.

Ephesians 1:15-23

I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason ¹⁶I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. ¹⁷I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, ¹⁸so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, ¹⁹and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. ²⁰God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, ²¹far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. ²²And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, ²³which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

Matthew 25:31-46

Jesus said: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. ³²All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, ³³and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. ³⁴Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; ³⁵for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, ³⁶I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.' ³⁷Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink?' ³⁸And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing?' ³⁹And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' ⁴⁰And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.' ⁴¹Then he will say to those at his left hand, 'You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; ⁴²for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, ⁴³I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not

give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.’⁴⁴ Then they also will answer, ‘Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?’⁴⁵ Then he will answer them, ‘Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.’⁴⁶ And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.”

These were combined with the donations collected at the other local churches, bringing the total to more than 675 boxes and bags of non-perishable food and supplies for local food cupboards! This will provide more than 50,000 meals for our neighbors in need! Messiah's donations were delivered to the Mattie N. Dixon Food Cupboard in Ambler and they were most grateful to receive the goods and replenish their shelves. Thank you to everyone who contributed! And to the YOM members and leaders who sorted and packed and delivered the donations!

WEEKLY FOOD COLLECTION FOR MANNA ON MAIN STREET: As you do your grocery shopping each week, please remember to pick up some non-perishable food, toiletry items, and cleaning products. Bring them to church and leave them on the back pew. Each week, parish volunteers transport these items to the local food pantry, Manna on Main Street in Lansdale, for distribution to those in need within our community.

YOGA CLASSES: UPATE: For the next two weeks, classes led by Diana Mulroy, will be live streamed instead of in person. Each session costs \$10, and all proceeds benefit local social service agencies usually supported through Belfry Bargains funds.
