Away in a manger, no crib for a bed, the little Lord Jesus laid down his sweet head The stars in the bright sky looked down where he lay, the little Lord Jesus asleep on the hay.

HYMN "It came upon the midnight clear"

It came upon the midnight clear, that glorious song of old, from angels bending near the earth to touch their harps of gold: "Peace on the earth, good will to men, from heaven's all-gracious King." The world in solemn stillness lay to hear the angels sing.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate; was crucified, died, and was buried.

Jesus, so holy, so pure, so good, was put to death; hung on a cross by Pontius Pilate, a cruel Roman judge. And all seemed lost when he was buried in a tomb ... but it wasn't.

I believe God raised Jesus from the dead.

On Easter Sunday, Jesus' disciples saw him alive again; and all his friends rejoiced and sang: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.
